Emerson Distance Star Is Class of Largest Field Ever to Compete in Championship Race.

Henry Frederiksen, Emerson High School's crack distance runner, added additional laurels to many he has already stowed away by pacing the largest field ever entered in the annual State High School cross-country championship run to the tape by a large margin on Saturday morning over the Branch Brook Park course in Newark. Slowed down to some extent by the soggy footing the "Bluebelle" ace nevertheless clipped off the two-lap course in the fine time of 13 minutes 18.4 seconds and is rated an excellent chance to cop the National Championship run on Thanksgiving morning.

Frederiksen, along with Bill Spence of Paterson Central and Vince Carnevale of Newark Central, led the pack throughout the first lap and this trio continued well bunched during the greater part of the second and final lap. However, about a quarter mile from the finish the Emerson youngster turned on the "heat" and pulled away from his rival with ease to finish over 100 yards in front of the second place Spence. Carnevale faltered badly in the closing stages of the race and was able to place no better than sixth.

Newark Central, however, ended the eight-year title reign of Passaic High by winning the team championship with East Rutherford second and Barringer of Newark third.

Several other county boys finished among the 25 leaders, Harry Halstead of Kearny placing eleventh and Max Gobbo of Demarest finishing in eighteenth place. However, none of the county schools finished
