



Mack sets mark, adds state run to winning streak

ELIZABETH, Nov. 11—Bob Mack, Weequahic High's sensational distance runner, completed the cycle here today by winning the state Class A scholastic cross country title in record time.

Mack toured the tough two and one-half mile Warinanco Park course in 12:44.4, clipping four seconds from the old mark set by Moorestown's Rod Zwirner in 1954, to beat a field of Group 4 high school and Catholic A runners.

The five-foot, seven-inch, 130-pound Weequahic star won the Newark and Essex County championship within the last two weeks.

Mack's performance captured the spotlight in a day that saw Eric Groom of Leonia win the Class B (Group 3, Catholic B) title and Pete Hoey of Mountain Lakes take the Class C (Groups 1 and 2 and Catholic C) crown.

The team titles went to Plainfield (Class A), Tenafly (Class B) and Mountain Lakes (Class C). Plainfield had a low of 105 to edge out Columbia, with 117. Weequahic ran fifth, despite Mack's record-breaking showing. Tenafly edged Leonia, 126-129, and Mountain Lakes, placing four men in the

first six, easily beat out Metuchen, 23-78.

Mack paced the field from the start and finished about 150 yards in front of Seton Hall's Ed Wyrich.

Groom, Leonia senior, had just as easy a time of it, finishing 16 seconds and more than 100 yards ahead of Ken Lovell of Camden Wilson. Hoey beat out teammate Arnold Brunzlick by 60 yards.

Kearny booters top Trenton, 2-1

KEARNY, Nov. 11—Kearny High, which shared last year's Group 4 state soccer title with Ridgewood, virtually eliminated Trenton from contention today, 2-1.

Trenton, hoping to stay alive for a playoff berth, took the lead in the opening minute of play on James Knox's goal. Kearny came back on Don Biott's goal in the second period and Roland Rauskas' winning score in the fourth period.
