

# Weequahic's Mack wins N.J. run again in schoolboy finale

ELIZABETH—Bob Mack of Weequahic High completed a spectacular schoolboy racing career by winning the Class A title of the 38th annual State Cross-Country Championship for the second straight year yesterday at Warinanco Park.

Besides Mack's successful defense, Pete Hoey also repeated in the Class C Division to lead Mountain Lakes to its second straight team title.

Plainfield failed to retain its title in Class A, in which Group 4 and Catholic A schools competed, yielding to New Brunswick. The latter won the title for the first time in its history with a low total of 89 points to runner-up Plainfield's 99.

## TITLE TO TRINITY

Columbia, winner of the Essex County championship, was third with 118 while Weequahic, despite Mack's performance, was next with 155. Central was sixth and Seton Hall ninth as Essex was well represented among the first 10 finishers.

Holy Trinity of Westfield beat out 1957 champion Lincoln of Jersey City for the Class B title. Holy Trinity, which had three runners in the top 10, had 131 points, eight lower than Lincoln.

Mack, a junior graduating next June, finished his career with eight important championships and only one defeat in three years of racing. The Weequahic harrier, who lost in the state meet as a freshman, went on to win three Newark city and three Essex County titles besides his two state championships.

213 runners and led Mack until the two-mile mark. At this point, the Weequahic star took charge and pulled away to lead by 20 yards with a quarter-mile left in the two and one-half mile race.

Mack broke the tape in 12:51 with a 100-yard lead over Williams. His clocking was well short of his state record of 12:44.2 set last year.

John King of Lincoln, Hudson County individual champion, finished strong to beat Don Growley of Hanover Park in 13:00.6 in the Class B race.
