

# Shattuck sets record, Vineland harriers win

Ed Shattuck of Central Regional shattered the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association cross-country meet record yesterday at Warinanco Park, Elizabeth.

Even so, Shattuck's effort was overshadowed by the tremendous performance staged by Greg Ryan and his Essex Catholic teammates in the parochial division.

Essex Catholic, with Ryan winning the individual title for the second straight year, defended its parochial crown by placing five runners in the first 14 places for a low total of 33 points.

Ryan soared past the finish line of the two and one-half mile course in 12:26.3. The clocking broke his own group record from 1963 to 12:39 and temporarily established a state meet mark.

The old standard was the 12:28.4 by Jack Endrikat of Hanover Park in 1962.

**BUT RYAN'S** individual glory lasted less than an hour as Shattuck defended in the combined Groups 1 and 2 class in 12:25.7.

Vineland beat defending champion Westfield for the Group 4 title with 83 points. Westfield was runner up at 118, edged Somerville (86) in Group 3, while Raritan's 146 was low in Groups 1 and 2.

It was the 44th running of the and attracted a record-breaking total of teams and competitors. There were 800 runners and 131 teams.

Cold weather and brisk winds whipped across Warinanco and prevented Ryan and Shattuck from doing even better.

**SHATTUCK'S RECORD** time must have been particularly satisfying. Just three weeks ago, the Central Regional senior set a Warinanco Park course record of 12:12.4.

One week later, Ryan came along and lowered the record to 12:11.5.

Ryan led all the way yesterday and finished some 45 yards ahead of Bob Kennedy of Our Lady of the Valley of Orange. Kennedy also was runner-up last year.

It was the 16th straight championship meet victory for Essex Catholic since former Villanova star Fred Dwyer took over the coaching reins last year. Ryan, who is expected to approach a 4:10 mile during the outdoor track season, is either headed for Villanova or an Ivy

League school when he graduates in June.

The Essex Catholic team ranks as the most powerful in state cross-country Catholic. Completing the Eagles scoring were juniors Fred Lane, fifth, and Art Martin, ninth, and sophomore Marty Liguori, 14th.

**CHRISTIAN BROTHERS** Academy finished second with 64 points. Roselle Catholic, led by Mike Garvey's third place, was third with 85 and Seton Hall fourth with 140. The parochial division was rated the strongest in state competition this season.

Shattuck renewed his three-year rivalry with Don Morgan of Clearview. Both runners

matched strides for the first mile and one-half before Shattuck started to pull away.

Morgan dropped back and Jim Crawford of Ridge took off in pursuit of Shattuck. But Shattuck was too strong and beat Crawford by 75 yards. Morgan had to be content with third, 45 yards to the rear.

Westfield's Ken Robinson held a slim lead until the final quarter-mile cinder path. Then Dave Hunt of Teaneck surged ahead and beat Robinson by 50 yards for the Group 4 championship.

In Group 3, Phil Peterson of Watchung Hills, who finished third last year for Moorestown, crossed the finish line in front of Curt Jones of Somerville in 12:50.3.
