

Bernards, Brick win in X-country

All four defending state public school cross-country champions won their sectional meets handily yesterday morning as 80 schools qualified for next Saturday's championships at Pennsauken High School.

Three of the 1966 winners were at Buccleuch Park for the Central Jersey qualifying trials. Bernards won in Group 1, Brick in Group 3 and Westfield in Group 4. The fourth was Overbrook, which took the South Jersey Group 2 sectional crown at Pennsauken.

The only 1966 individual champ in competition yesterday was Russ Taintor of Brick, who won the Central Jersey race easily from teammate Dom Camero in 12:29.1, fastest time of the day at Buccleuch Park. The other individual winners there were Bill Criss of Highland Park in Group 2, Ron Rounsaville of Delaware Valley in Group 1 and Charlie Zipprich of Edison in Group 4. Highland Park joined Westfield, Brick and Bernards as a team winner.

At Warnanco Park, Elizabeth, West Jersey teams dominated the competition. Kinnelon won in Group 1 with its Kevin Dunn taking individual honors in 12:47.7. Warren Hills was the Group 2 champ as Tim Steele of Morris Knolls upset Richie Stein of Roselle for the gold medal in 12:26.9. Morrisstown swept the Group 4 title with no trouble, beating Parsippany, 42-73.

All that Essex County got out of this meet was a team victory by Newark West Side in Group 3 and a brilliant individual triumph by Richie Furst in Group 4. Furst had the meet's fastest time there, 12:24.4.

Gogolak mark falls, Wyoming romps, 42-6

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (UPI) — Jerry DePoyster, the nation's leading kicker, booted for 16 points and broke two NCAA records yesterday as Wyoming's seventh-ranked Cowboys notched their 13th straight victory, 42-6, in a Western Athletic Conference contest with New Mexico.

The 6-2 senior booted four field goals and kicked three extra points, bringing his career points to 175, five more than the record set by Princeton's Charlie Gogolak in 1963-65. He re-established his collegiate field goal record at 34.

Wyoming's Vic Washington (Plainfield, N.J.) smashed a 24-year-old national punt return mark as he logged his 50th and brought his total punt return yardage to 539. The previous season record of 49 returns was set by Thomas Flanagan in 1943.

Wyoming's fifth-ranked defense held the Lobos to minus 29 yards rushing while an impressive Cowboy offense covered 454 yards.

Wyoming became the only team in WAC history to go 29 straight seasons without a conference loss. The win gave them their fifth conference victory this season and the ninth straight in this year's play.
