

INMAN CAPTURES PAROCHIAL A RACE Kronick romps in Group 4 X-country

Harry Kronick of Franklin Township ran the opposition into the ground as he added the NJSIAA Group 4 cross-country championship to his long list of laurels yesterday at Warinanco Park, Elizabethtown.

Kronick turned in the fastest time in the seven group champion races as he outran Mark Roddy of Lenape by 60 yards in 12:11.4. The state and Eastern outdoor mile champ ran the last half of the race by himself after Gary Mitchell of Middletown had pressed him to a 4:33 first mile.

Chris Inman of Essex Catholic took the day's other premier race as he won the Parochial A title by a 12 yards from Tim Connehey of Paramus Catholic in 12:14.9. Kronick and Inman, along with the first 10 finishers in each race yesterday, qualified for the first all-group title race Wednesday at Ocean County Park, Lakewood.

Haddon Township was the only school to defend its title, winning handily in Group 2. Bernards took its fifth Group 1 title in seven years. Overbrook added the Group 3 title to five previous victories in Groups 2 and 3 and Red Bank Catholic took the Parochial B title for the first time since 1968.

First-time winners included Middletown and Parsippany Hills in an unprecedented tie in Group 4, Paramus Catholic in Parochial A and St. Joseph's, Toms River, in the new Parochial C race.

Middletown and Parsippany Hills tied in Group 4 with 147 points each while North Edison (152) was closed behind in third. Pete Manning and Gary Mitchell led Middletown in sixth and ninth place, respectively, while Frank Kirkland was 15th and Scott Sheehy 18th for Parsippany.

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) — Steve Sweeney, California's record-breaking pass receiver, ended his college football career yesterday with a diving end zone catch as time ran out and gave the Bears a 24-21 upset victory over Stanford in the 75th meeting between the two Pacific-8 rivals.

Freshman quarterback Vince Ferragamo threw the winning touchdown pass on a fourth play down from the Stanford seven-yard line. Cal was behind 21-18 but gambled on the pass play rather than try for a field goal which would have tied the game.
