

GLADUE GIRLS CHAMP

Weber captures crown

It was the routine and the unexpected as Ann Gladue of Bayley-Ellard and Joe Weber of Kearny won the state all-group high school cross-country championships yesterday morning at Holmdel Country Park.

Miss Gladue, a junior, made it nine victories in as many major races this fall as she defeated Mary Banks of Raritan by 60 yards in 18:43.2 Weber, a senior, scored his first major triumph of the fall as

he led home Steve Thompson of Brick by the same margin in 15:49.6. Both winning times were slightly off the course records set last week.

The boys' team battle was the closest ever with four teams finishing within four points of each other. Memorial of West New York, a bridesmaid the last few years, finally broke into the winner's circle with 102 points as Brick placed second with 105 and Christian Brothers and Morris Catholic wound up with 106.

Brick also was second in the girls' race to Toms River North, which reversed last year's order by a 51-65 margin. Red Bank Catholic, the winner from 1972 through 1976, was third with 96.

John McCarthy of Holmdel led the boys' race over the first half mile but then dropped out. Thompson took over, followed closely by Weber and Jim Smith of Haddonfield. At the two-mile mark, Weber broke away and had no trouble after that.

Al Solano was the first

runner over the line for Memorial in sixth place, followed by Lenny Hernandez in 11th, Jorge Caycedo in 26th, Paul Scire in 57th and Lazaro Robles in 69th. The team score is lower than the total of these places since individual entries do not count in the final compilation.

Miss Gladue ran one of her typical come-from-behind races to take the girls' title. She was no better than 15th heading into the back hills and was still second to Miss Banks at the halfway point. But she moved up

after that and had no trouble taking the lead and moving out to a safe margin before the field returned to the grassy plain for the drive to the finish.

It was the second year in a row that Miss Banks had placed second in this race, after having been third as a sophomore in 1976. Eva Marie Berardi of Williamstown was third, Matawan sophomore Alyson Hendricks fourth and Brick senior Jeanne Fox fifth.

Sharon White and Janet Flood led Toms River North in 10th and 11th place, with freshman Lisa Szymanski 13th, Kerry Mason and Eileen Smith then completed the lineup in 28th and 35th positions.
