

SURVIVES DISQUALIFICATION

Gladue easily retains crown

Ann Gladue of Bayley-Ellard, the defending state All-Group champion, survived a technical disqualification call and easily won her second straight NISAA Group 1 cross-country championship yesterday at Holmdel County Park.

Gladue, a senior, ran away from freshman Meg Waldron of Bernards by more than 300 yards as she covered the hilly 3.1 mile course in 19:19. The clocking was easily the fastest of the four girls' group races with Waldron's time of 19:14 the second best of the day.

The other individual winners were Beverly Rockhill of Hamilton West in Group 4 at 19:27.3, Mary Ellen McGowan of Pascack Valley in Group 3 at 19:37.1 and Lisa Pakutka of Hopatcong in Group 2 at 19:22.5.

The four team races went pretty much to form. Hunterdon Central, ranked No. 1 in the state, won Group 4, 83-109, over Toms River North. Old Tappan took Group 3 from North Hunterdon, 54-88. St. John Vianney defeated neighbor Holmdel

in Group 2, 100-139, and Bernards defended its Group 1 title, 33-43, over Mater Dei.

It was after the Group 1 race that Gladue, the state's premier girls' cross-country runner, encountered her problems. A protest was lodged that she and Bayley-Ellard teammate Michelle Rago were not wearing school issue uniforms. Ann ran in the same black shirt and gold pants that she has worn without previous complaint all season.

The protest was upheld by meet referee John Ragone. But some 15 minutes later that decision was overturned by the jury of appeals.

The Bernards' team triumph in the Group 1 race was its third group title in a row since the Somerset school took Group 2 honors in 1977. Waldron was followed by Jane Armstrong in seventh place; Julie Blanchet in eighth; Barbara Lagarenne in 15th, and Amy Meyer in 16th.

Rockhill was a surprise winner in the Group 4 race in her first major competition outside of her home area in Mercer County. She won by 40 yards from Lori Butterfield of Hunterdon Central. Crick Batz was third for Hunterdon Central and Stephanie Guidotti sixth, but Liese Schaff, normally the third girl on the team, dropped out of the race, making the final margin much closer than expected.

In Group 3, Old Tappan ran the best team race of the day with Debbie Meberg leading the way in third place at 19:51. Colleen Dunn fifth at 19:54 and Meg Murtagh 10th at 20:06. The individual favorite in this race, Theresa Gschwind of Summit was absent with permission of meet officials and will be in the All-Group race next Saturday. McGowan won the race by 60 yards from Doreen Statare of Paul VI of Hanfordfield.

Pakutka, a pint-sized sophomore, ran away from defending champion Eva Marie Berardi of Williamstown by 100 yards to take the Group 2 title. St. John Vianney had Ann Marie Martinek in fourth at 20:07 and Cammy Kelly 19th at 21:16.

The top three teams and first 10 individuals in each of the four races will advance to the All-Group meet.

Defense keys Snyder past Vailsburg

Fred Pinckney threw for two touchdowns to Zane Corbin. Steve Hodnett ran for two touchdowns and the Snyder defense limited Vailsburg to 41 yards in a 35-0 victory yesterday at Kennedy Stadium, Hoboken.

Hodnett, a junior halfback, got unbeaten Snyder on the way to its seventh success when he plunged one yard in the first quarter. Snyder took the opening kickoff 61 yards in three plays.

In the second quarter, Pinckney passed five yards to Corbin to finish a 61-yard march. On the first play of Snyder's next possession, Pinckney threw a 15-yard flare pass to Corbin at the right sideline and Corbin raced another 40 yards for the score.

In the third quarter, Terrence Jenkins added a 23-yard scoring run to cap a 64-yard march in which he reeled off gains of 14, five and 23 yards.

Minutes later, Hodnett bulldozed over from the one and ran for the two-pointer to complete the scoring.

Jenkins, a senior fullback, picked up a game-high 101 yards on 14 carries and Pinckney made good on each of his three passes for 81 yards. It was Snyder's first shutout of the year. Vailsburg fell to 1-7.
