

# Sheehan wins, Westfield 2d in all-groups

Christian Brothers Academy had its closest call of the past two seasons as it won a second consecutive NJSIAA boys' all-group cross-country championship yesterday at windswept Holmdel County Park.

North Hunterdon, on the other hand, breezed to the girls' title, 53-99, over Ridgewood, placing all five of its team among the first 25 finishers. The individual titles went to Cliff Sheehan of Westfield in the boys' race and freshman Janet Smith of North Edison in the girls'.

Christian Brothers, which has not lost a New Jersey race since the 1978 all-group meet, came out the winner in a close three-way battle with Westfield and Bernards. Coach Tom Heath had already conceded victory to Westfield when the count of the scoring cards gave CBA 82 points to 86 for Westfield and 89 for the all-underclass Bernards team.

Westfield took three of the first four places in its personal duel with CBA, but the defending champion salvaged the victory on the respective placements of the fourth and fifth runners. Bernards lost its chance to win when its first runner trailed home the first three boys from both Westfield and CBA.

"I thought we lost it," recalled Heath, "when Ken McLeod lost 20 places in the last 100 yards." McLeod, usually CBA's second man, was the fourth one over the line for his team this time in 34th place. But he still picked up seven key points over his Westfield counterpart, Jim Rorden.

Sheehan won the race in the same course-record time he had run a week ago in the Group 4 meet, 15:50. Trailing him over the line in 17:57 was Manalapan junior Tom Fischer, followed by Greg Noll of Morris Catholic, Don Deckert of Oakcrest and the CBA leader, John McCabe.

Westfield got a further lift when juniors Dave Fitzgerald and John Cacchione finished ahead of Ed Hillman and Paul Marabito of CBA. But the McLeod-Rorden finish got CBA within one point in the team tally and John Vickers came in five team places ahead of Greg Kasko of Westfield to seal the victory.

There was no such problem in the girls' team battle. Ridgewood had been expected to give North Hunterdon as close a tussle as when the teams finished four points apart in the Easterns last month. But North Hunterdon repeated that victory with plenty to spare.

Smith, who weighs less than 80 pounds, came out of the hills with a large margin over Meg Waldron of Bernards and went on to win by 100 yards in 18:43, fastest time at Holmdel this year. Lisa Pakutka of Hopatcong, the Group 2 champion, was third in 19:06.

Missing the race, because of illness, was Theresa Gschwind of Summit but two recent recoveries from the sick list. Beverly Rockhill of Hamilton West and Stacey Aromano of Whippany Park, placed fourth and fifth.

Sharon Greene led North Hunterdon in ninth place, followed quickly by freshman teammate Tracy Bigley in 11th. The Mileski twins, Mary Ellen and Patty, placed 14th and 15th for Ridgewood, but then came the rest of the North Hunterdon team, freshman Stacey Bilotta in 10th, Marge DeMarrais in 17th and Kim

Senior Dan Diceanu scored two goals and Jeff Rizzo and Chris Brain each had a goal and an assist to lead seventh-ranked Bloomfield to a 5-0 victory over Bayonne in the final of the North Jersey, Section 1, Group 4 state soccer tournament yesterday at Ramapo College, Mahwah.

Diceanu, a left wing, headed in the first two goals to give him 21 for the season. Rizzo, a senior right wing, scored his 21st midway through the first quarter to lift Bloomfield (20-3-2) a 3-0 lead.

Chris Brain and Joe Sebastiano scored the final two goals for Bloomfield, which outshot Bayonne (16-3-1), 35-5.
