

Immaculate's Lipkus takes Parochial B run

Bernards scored a perfect 19 points to win its fourth straight state high school boys' cross-country championship yesterday at Monmouth County Park in Holmdel.

Ed Mather's team took the first six places in the Group I race to win its 14th group title in the last 17 years. Bernards has not lost in the group meet since 1973 but its Group I string was interrupted in 1977 when it moved to Group 2 for one year.

Favorites were most of the six boys' races over the windswept Holmdel course. Westfield took its third Group 4 title in a row and fifth in the last six years. North Hunterdon beat Parsippany to complete a boy-girl double in Group 5. Voorhees captured its first state title in Group 2 and Delbarton also won for the first time in Parochial A.

The only surprise of the day came in Parochial B where Mater Dei scored an easy victory over Paul VI of Clifton and the defending champion, Bishop Esopus, finished a distant fourth.

The victory was appropriate enough for the Mater Dei coach is Jack Hatter Jr., whose father was director of the meet.

Individually, Tom Fischer of Manalapan led the field, as he has all seasons, by winning the Group 3 title for a second year in 1980.7, well off his course record of 19:41. Carlos Hane of Central Regional was the second fastest winner at 16:54 in the Group 2 race.

The other individual winners were Paul Stogryn of Bernards in Group 1 at 14:01.8, Lou Ross of Delbarton in Parochial A at 16:13.4 and Bill Lipkus of Immaculate in Parochial B at 14:46.1.

Bernards ran the Group 1 race almost as a training exercise. Mather sent his boys off slow and they gradually moved through the park to take the first six places at the finish. Stogryn was followed by teammates Chris Bianchi, Tim Peters, Rory Farrell, John Carrietti and Mike Hinman.

Delbarton was almost an impressive in the much stronger Parochial A race. Ross kicked past Ernie Lugo of St. Joseph of Montvale in the 900 yards to win the individual medal. Teammate Kevin Walsh, Ed Donogue and Jim Ronchella were all among the first 15 finishers for a 58-43 victory over St. John Vianney. Bergen Catholic took the third qualifying slot for next Saturday's all-group race with Christian Brothers, all-group champion the last two years, failing to make the grade by finishing sixth.

Westfield got a great race from sophomore Andy Jacob, who finished fourth at 16:54 to go with Dave Fitzgerald's fourth-place finish in a 11:13.77 victory over Sayreville. Hamilton won by 20 yards from Bruce Miller of Cherry Hill East.

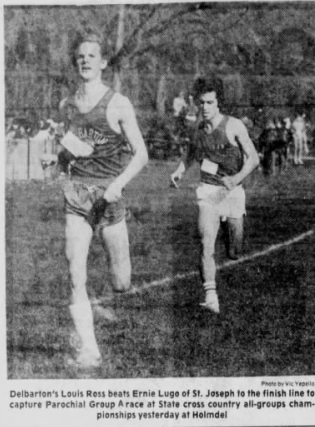

Smith sets course record; Waldron, Gschwind win

Jane Smith of North Edison set a course record of 18:15.8 to repeat as the state girls' cross-country Group 4 champion yesterday at Monmouth County Park in Holmdel.

Smith, a sophomore, who has never lost a major school cross-country race, finished 200 yards ahead of Michelle Rowen of Washington Township, the outdoor all-group champion at 1:50.0 meters. The previous course record of 18:17.4 had been set in the 1979 all-group meet by Ann Glade of Bayley-Ellard.

The victory by Smith was one of four scores by defending champions.

Theresa Gschwind of Summit won her second Group 3 title in 18:30.1.

Lisa Pakaska of Hopatcong took her third Group 1 title in 18:51.2.

Janice Meg Waldron of Bernards won her second Group 1 crown in 18:26.

Only Pakaska had a close race. The City Hopatcong senior had to sprint the last 50 yards to defeat Melinda Holm of Menham, who ran an even 19:00.

The team titles went to Barnian in Group 4, defending North Hunterdon in Group 3, John Vianney in Group 2 and Bernards in Group 1. North Hunterdon and Bernards also won boys' group titles.

Barnian avenged a seasonal loss to Hamilton East with its 101-118 victory. Denise Barrett led the Barnian team in 10th place at 20:17 with Michelle SanFilippo and freshman Chris Besinger also among the first 25 finishers.

Gschwind won the Group 3 race by 400 yards from Patti McCleskey of Dumont, coming back from a recent illness.

The North Hunterdon parade began in third place with Sharon Greene, who was followed immediately by sophomore teammate Tracy Bagley. The other three North Hunterdon runners, Marge DeMarras, Stacy Skolota and Kim Brent, were also among the top 10 to complete a 31-126 victory over Passaic Valley.

Group 2 provided the closest team race of the meet. St. John Vianney edged Mount Olive, 75-63. Carol Valigorsky was first over the line for St. John Vianney in fifth place at 20:06, with teammates Leslie Gale and Ann LaRosa finishing fifth and 14th. The Cretas sisters, Camille and Sabina, finished fourth and 19th for Mount Olive.

Bernards took four of the first five places in Group 1 in defeat. Mater Dei, 28-71. Waldron won by 400 yards from teammate Jane Armstrong, with another Bernards runner, Amy Meyer, placing third. Roxanne Polo of Whippany Park broke in fourth place but was followed over the line by Jersey Falls of Bernards.
